"My name is Bella, I'm 17 and in my last year at <u>St George's</u> <u>School</u> in Edinburgh. I'm from Beijing and have been studying here since the start of my <u>GCSEs</u>, three years ago.

I was at an international school in Beijing. A friend from my old school left to study in the UK and told me that <u>Edinburgh</u> was a great place to study and experience a new culture. After discussing it with my family, I decided to come to Scotland so I could get a better understanding of the education system and immerse myself in the local culture.

I chose Edinburgh because a family friend lives here and could act as my guardian to help me settle in. My parents thought a safe, quieter city than London would help me focus more on my studies. My guardian has provided a lot of <u>support</u>, like giving me a tour of the city when I first arrived.
